

QMCR Freshers' Week Guide 2018

Tuesday 25 September —

17:00 Drinks served for early arrivers in the MCR Woodville Room

If you are arriving early, then join us for some casual drinks in the MCR, followed by dinner in Cripps Hall. We will then go to The Eagle, one of Cambridge's famous pubs, leaving from the Plodge at 19:00.

Thursday 27 September —

Most graduates will arrive on this day. If you're moving into a college house or main site room, collect your room keys and university card from the College Porters' Lodge (Plodge) in Silver Street. If you're moving into Owlstone Croft collect your room key and university card from Owlstone Porters' Lodge. If you're moving into private accommodation you'll still need to collect your university card from the College Plodge. Check your pigeon hole - you will have one in the main college Plodge and one at your place of residence!

12:00 – 16:00 Student registration in the Armitage Room (staircase FF)

Passport, visa and ID document scanning. Alternatively you can do this on Friday 28 Sept.

17:00 Tea and biscuits in the MCR Woodville Room

18:00 Buttery dinner in Cripps Hall

Dinner is served between 17.45 and 19:00 during term time. In the cafeteria you can pay with cash, or with your university card as soon as you have set up your UPAY account (see Fresher's pack).

19:00 Visit to the *Anchor Pub* , leave from the *Porter's Lodge (Plodge)*

Join us at 19:00 at the Plodge for a visit to the Anchor Pub and meet your fellow graduates and us – your MCR committee! The pub is right across the road from the porter's lodge and hard to miss - join us there later if that suits you better. We will have a separate space booked for Oueens'.

Friday 28 September —

10:00 – 12:30 Student registration in the Armitage Room (staircase FF)

Passport, visa and ID document scanning.

12:00 - 16:00 Graduate Registration, starts in QBar

This day holds some official induction events including the signing of the matriculation register, after which you are formally a student of Queens' college. This is also when you will receive your university card. The compulsory events on this day are as follows:

13:00 Tutors and staff welcome presentations in *Fitzpatrick Hall*

14:15 Signing of matriculation register in the *President's Lodge*

14:30 – 16:15 Afternoon tea in the *President's Lodge's Garden (Old Hall if raining)*

18:00 Buttery dinner in Cripps Hall

20:00 Official MCR welcome reception in Old Hall

We will hold a welcome reception in the evening; the dress code is formal—no gowns. Typically this means either a dark lounge suit and tie or a dress from just above the knee to about two inches above the ankle, or other formal wear.

Saturday 29 September ——————

11:00 – 13:30 Brunch in *Cripps Hall* and coffee and Grad Buddy induction in *QBar*

The MCR will host a Grad Buddy Q&A session in the QBar conservatory with coffee, tea and biscuits. This is the opportunity for you to meet your Grad Buddies, continuing students at Queens' college studying subjects close to yours, and those studying at Queens' in similar fields. You can drop in at any time after 11:00.

13:30 – 14:15 College tour with Joe Stallard, convene at the *Mathematical Bridge* Have a taste of Joe's unsurpassed love for this college and its rich history.

14:15 – 15:00 Practical Cambridge tour with Juan Sebastian Cañavera, meet at *Old Gate*

After some time in Cambridge, a number of practical questions may arise: where do I find a good pharmacy, some cheap electricity adaptors, or a supermarket that is

15:00 – 18:00 MCR punting and cream tea, *MCR Woodville Room*

We hope to see you at 15:00 for a relaxed afternoon. Cambridge is home to punting and Queens' College owns four punts themselves (though the fleet may see a slight expansion throughout the year). As not all of you will fit into the punts simultaneously, we will serve tea and scones at the same time in the Woodville Room. The punts moor next to the Woodville Room so just come and see us there!

10:00 – 11:00 MCR run club, Owlstone Croft Plodge

11:00 – 13:00 Brunch in *Cripps hall*

11:00 - 13:00 Portraits on the Erasmus Lawn

Right before the matriculation photo there is an opportunity to have your portrait taken on the Erasmus Lawn, formally dressed and with gown.

13:30 Matriculation photo, Walnut Tree Court

The photo will be taken in Walnut Tree Court and the dress code is formal **with gown** (strictly enforced). Make sure you arrive on time and properly dressed. Options are: a black or very dark grey/blue lounge suit and necktie with a plain, long-sleeved, collared white shirt; or a very dark long-sleeved long dress; or full-length trousers with a white or black blouse. Wear black shoes of a sober style (no sandals, open-toe shoes, boots or trainers). **Make sure you have your gown with you!**

14:00 - 17:00 Mixer event, starts in Cripps hall

The rest of the afternoon is filled with induction events. The mixer event in Cripps hall, is followed by a scavenger hunt throughout the college and, at 4pm, a subject cluster groups meet-up with refreshments, in the *Old Hall and Old*

Kitchens . You will be walking quite a lot, so wear sensible shoes.

19:00 Tea in the *Woodville Room*, followed by a film screening in the *Fitzpatrick Hall*

Elizabeth Weir – this year's welfare officer – is hosting the first welfare tea of the year in the Woodville Room. This will be followed by a film screening in the Fitzpatrick hall, where we will watch a great film — to be announced! Pizza and snacks will be provided.

Drinks are served in the Fitzpatrick hall at 18:45, the dinner itself is immediately after that in Cripps hall and Old Hall (depending on course). Dress code is as for the matriculation photo, **including gowns**.
